

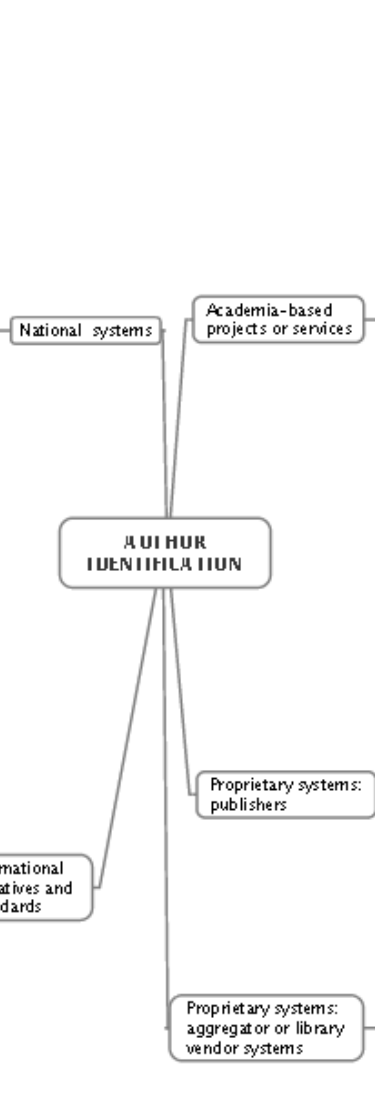

Why Important?

- Find potential collaborators
- Get credit for scholarly activities
- Institutions - Collect, showcase and evaluate scholarly activities of their faculty
- Publishers - Simplify the publishing workflow, including peer review
- Funding organizations - Simplify the grant submission workflow and track what happened to funded research
- Scholarly societies - Track the achievements of their members.



Traditional Name Authority Control: LC/NACO



LIBRARY OF CONGRESS AUTHORITIES

Using *Library of Congress Authorities*, you can browse and view authority headings for Subject, Name, Title and Name/Title combinations; and download authority records in MARC format for use in a local library system. This service is offered free of charge.

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LC/NACO Limitations

- Creation process is not dynamic; few librarians authorized to create
- MARC format of authorities can be confusing for non-librarians
- Creators can't "own" or contribute to their identities
- Problems with disambiguation
- Authorized form of name is a text string; no embedded metadata that links authorized form with authority record

VIAF – Virtual International Authority File

Combine and disambiguate national authority files

- Link various national authority files into one virtual authority file
- Joint project between LOC and German National Library – hosted by OCLC
- Shared publicly online, integrated with Wikimedia/pedia

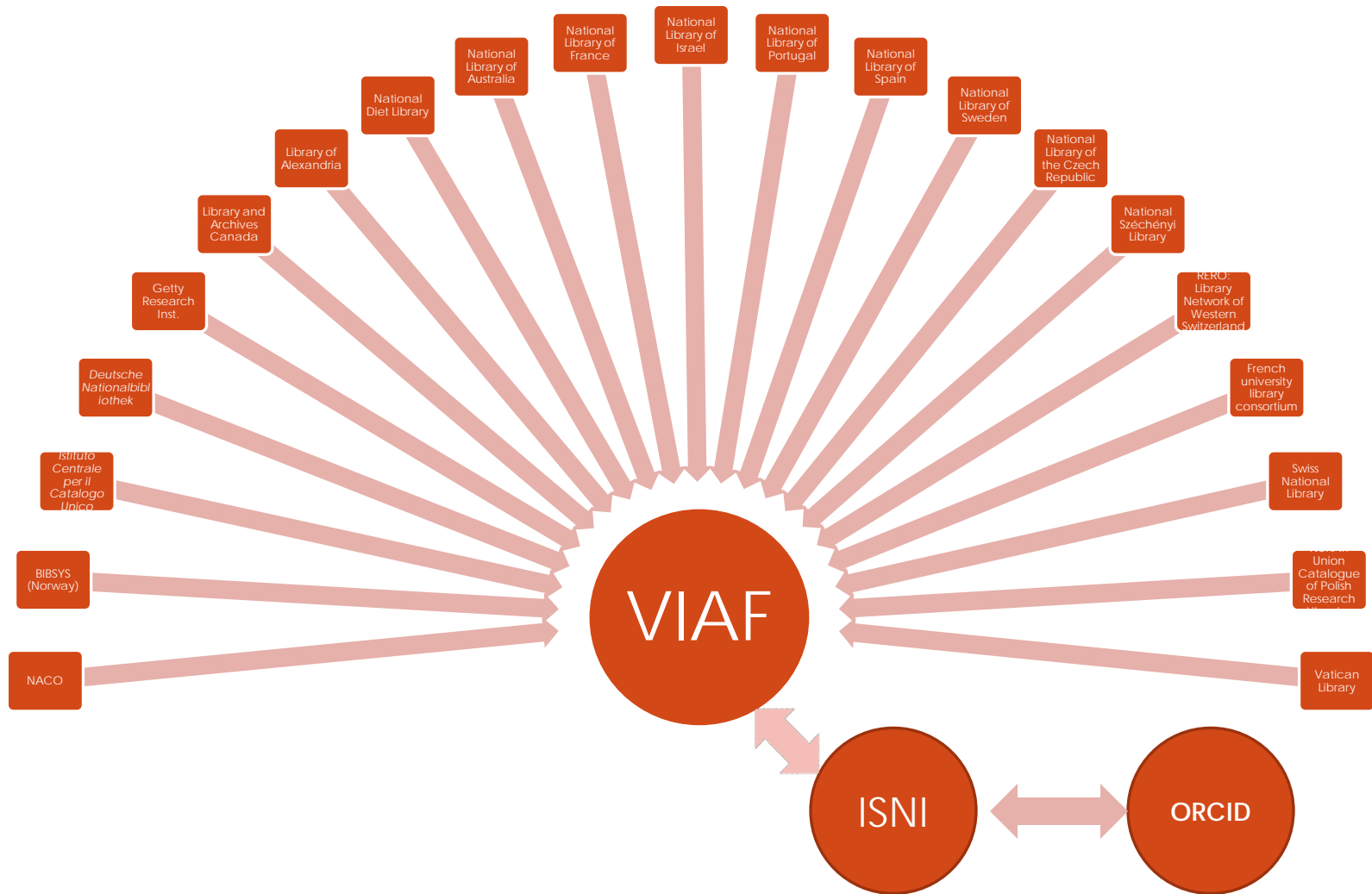
ISNI – International Standard Name Identifier

Expansive project to apply a 16 digit identifier to public identities for creators

- Broad scope: authors, researchers and artists
- ISO standard applied to multiple domains: library authority files; rights management, professional and trade databases
- Encompasses both living and deceased creators

ORCID

"ORCID aims to solve the name ambiguity problem in research and scholarly communications by creating a **central registry of unique identifiers for individual researchers and an open and transparent linking mechanism between ORCID and other current researcher ID schemes.** These identifiers, and the relationships among them, can be linked to the researcher's output to enhance the scientific discovery process and to improve the efficiency of research funding and collaboration within the research community."

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ORCID provides a persistent digital identifier that distinguishes you from every other researcher and, through integration in key research workflows such as manuscript and grant submission, supports automated linkages between you and your professional activities ensuring that your work is recognized. ORCID has been working with many member organizations to make it easy to connect your ORCID iD, and import information from their records. Choose one of the imports wizards to get started.

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Import your research datasets into ORCID from Australian National Data Service (ANDS) and Research Data Australia (RDA). ANDS is partnering with Australian research institutions and data producing agencies to improve discovery and reusability of research data across many research domains from earth science to technology and engineering.

CrossRef Metadata Search

Search CrossRef's comprehensive metadata on journal articles, conference proceedings and monographs. Easily add search results to your ORCID profile.

Europe PubMed Central

Europe PubMed Central (Europe PMC) offers this tool to enable you to link anything in Europe PMC to your ORCID. Europe PMC contains all of PubMed, 500K records from Agricola that cannot be found in PubMed, 4 million Patents and 2.6 million full text articles that we share with PMC in the USA.

ResearcherID

ResearcherID is a global, multi-disciplinary scholarly research community where members can register for unique identifier, build a profile of their scholarly works, view citation metrics, and search for like-minded researchers.
