Conservator's Note

This book was received by the Preservation Lab for treatment and housing. The book is a first edition printing of Prufrock and Other Observations. It is a multi-signature pamphlet, with a brown paper cover. The cover was wrapped in an acidic plastic case, which was not original to the edition. The front cover was completely detached from the pamphlet, and the back cover was split at the bottom joint. There was a small tear near the gutter of the title page.

The acidic plastic case was discarded. The paper cover was surface cleaned with an Absorbene smoke sponge. The first page, last page, and title page were surface cleaned with an Absorbene smoke sponge prior to further treatment. The title page was mended and reinforced at the gutter with usu gami thinnest

Japanese tissue and Zen Shofu wheat starch paste. The front board was rehinged and the back board was reinforced with usu gami thin Japanese tissue and wheat starch paste. The usu gami tissue was toned with acrylics to make the repair more sympathetic to the cover. The internal hinges were reinforced with usu gami thinnest v-hinges. The book received a protective CoLibri jacket and was housed in a manuscript folder.
