Dear sir and brother:

Will a few lines to you in addition to my letter of the 21 ult., be acceptable? Trust that you have heard from the east by this time; as to the address with the long names that I gave to you want to say that I have been informed that the letter that was received there did not contain the enclosure; will take it up with you further when next I see you which I trust will not be very long; was in hopes that you would be over Saturday and when you did not show, decided to write you and say that I hope that you will be able to make it next Saturday the 9 instant. As to the other matter that I spoke to you about wish to say that I have learned indirectly that the person that you made it your business to call on did not act as he should; well, that is not your fault; some folks are that way, they are so straight laced that they bend over backwards. That is when they are asked to serve some one else. Have not received the photo of the concrete tanker that you spoke to me about; did you send it?
