My dear George:

Just a few lines to acknowledge receipt of your welcome letter of the 25 inst., which came to hand in due time. As you say that you will try to be over Saturday I will be brief.

Had a letter in today's mail from ^{me} Joe's ⁱⁿ Indianapolis in which he said that the matter that we were interested had been sidetracked. That is some other sort of a move is to be made first and if nothing comes of it the worthy President is to take a run out this way in person.

Also had a letter from Brother Johnson of the District Council which of course told me in advance that my friend Healy was on the job; your recent letter confirmed my belief.

Have made note of a few matters that I want to go into in detail with you when you get over this way.

Things are about as usual at this end; hope that all goes well with you.

Do you find time to keep up with the news? There is so much doing that it seems almost an impossibility to keep in touch with it all. At any rate methinks we do make progress at times in spite of the opposition.
