Dear friend George:

I want to warn you not to come over to visit me until you find out in advance by phone if it will be possible for you to do so. Owing to a recurrence of the 'Flu epidemic there has been a ban on visitors here for the past week or so and I am not in a position to say just now when the ban will be lifted. Did not want you to have a useless trip. Well! I have some news for you the next time I see you in person and trust that you can make a similar statement. Have had two visits with Morrin, one the last of January and the other the 17 of February. Shorty went South with him and we may have some additional light on the subject when the former returns and has a chance to take a run over to see me. Say, I am worried about that matter from the East that I mentioned to you when you were over the x last time. Did you receive the money order? Bob wrote me from Indiana that he was certain that it was attended to at the Cincinnati end but to date I ~~st~~ lack the definite information and I do not like to have things dragging like that.
