My dear Fred:

Yours of May 2nd and July 10 came to hand in due time. I intended to write you to Maytown after I got your letter from there but I was waiting for some definite word from Indianapolis; it has not arrived as yet.

In your last from Cleveland you say that you wrote me from Indianapolis, Nitro, W. Va., Cabin creek, and Maytown. The letter from the latter place is the only one that I received. I wrote you to your Indianapolis address some months ago but received no reply. However, all's well that ends well and as you say that you are doing fine in my old town why I am satisfied. Then again you know that I am getting shorter every day and I will be calling on you and the rest of my Cleveland friends before you know it. Will be brief until I know that this reaches you.
